“Evidence Based Home Visitation: Science and Politics” at next Lunch with the League



The speaker for “Lunch with the League” on Tuesday, February 20, will be Susan Moore, regional program manager of Prevent Child Abuse Tennessee. Her presentation will cover the prevention of child abuse in Oak Ridge and Anderson County. The meeting will be held from 11:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Social Hall of the *Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church*, located at 809 Oak Ridge Turnpike.

Moore’s educational background is in business administration and elementary education. For the past 20 years, she has been involved in education and children’s issues, and has served as East Tennessee Programs Manager for Prevent Child Abuse Tennessee for five years. She is interested in the effects of childhood trauma on brain development, and in making “our community and the greater East Tennessee region more trauma informed.”

Moore is married and has two daughters: one a student at the University of Tennessee and the other an occupational therapist in Brooklyn, NY.

Lunch with the League is a public program open to the community. Membership in the *League of Women Voters* is not required and there is no cost to attend.

The presentation will begin at 12:00 noon. Lunches are provided by the Soup Kitchen and are available at 11:30 a.m. on a first-come basis for \$8, or you may bring your own. Coffee and tea are provided.
