“The Root Causes and Rise of Neo-Nazism in East Tennessee” is topic of next Lunch with the League

The speaker for “Lunch with the League” on Tuesday, May 15, will be David Clark, District Attorney General of Anderson County. His general topic will center on Neo-Nazism and the root causes for its rise in East Tennessee.

The meeting will be held from 11:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Social Hall of the *Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church*, located at 809 Oak Ridge Turnpike.

A native of Anderson County, Clark received bachelor’s, master’s and doctorate degrees from The University of Tennessee. Before returning to Anderson County to open his own law office, he was in private in Nashville. Clark served two terms as part-time County Attorney, prior to his election as District Attorney General of Anderson County in 2006, and again in 2014. He campaigned on the platform of making our community safer.

Clark has received many awards and recognitions including award of Excellence in Contributing to Child Protective Investigative Team, and “Power Award” from the Allies for Substance Abuse Prevention of Anderson County.

Lunch with the League is a public service program open to the community. Membership in the *League of Women Voters* is not required and there is no cost to attend.

The presentation will begin at 12:00 noon. Lunches are provided by the Soup Kitchen and are available at 11:30 a.m. on a first-come basis for \$8, or you may bring your own. Coffee and tea are provided.
