“Greenways Oak Ridge’s 25th Anniversary” topic of next Lunch with the League

Dan Robbins, chairman of Greenways Oak Ridge, will be the guest speaker at the Tuesday, April 17, Lunch with the League program. His presentation will focus on the history, current status, and future plans of the Greenways Oak Ridge organization, which celebrates 25 years of existence this year.

The meeting will be held from 11:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Social Hall of the *Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church*, located at 809 Oak Ridge Turnpike.

Robbins, who grew up on a tobacco farm in rural eastern North Carolina, earned his bachelor’s degree in chemistry from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He received his Ph.D degree in analytical chemistry from Princeton University, then spent a year at the Technical University of Norway on a Fulbright post-doctoral fellowship.

Robbins came to work at ORNL in 1967 as a research chemist, and later became the youngest division director at the Laboratory. He served as manager of the three-plant Analytical Chemistry laboratories. With 47 years of company service, he retired in 2013 as director of the Y-12 Analytical Chemistry laboratories.

Lunch with the League is a public program open to the community. Membership in the *League of Women Voters* is not required and there is no cost to attend.

The presentation will begin at 12:00 noon. Lunches are provided by the Soup Kitchen and are available at 11:30 a.m. on a first-come basis for \$8, or you may bring your own. Coffee and tea are provided.
