Oak Ridge Police Chief James Akagi to speak at Lunch with the League

Chief of Police Chief James Akagi will be the guest speaker at *Lunch with the League* on Tuesday, September 19.. *Lunch with the League* will be held from 11:45 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Social Hall of the *Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church*, located at 809 Oak Ridge Turnpike.

Hired in July 2011, Akagi, has nearly 35 years of enforcement experience. Prior to taking the reins as Chief of Police in Oak Ridge, Akagi served as assistant special agent of the Oklahoma City District Office of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

Akagi graduated from Wichita State University with a Bachelor of Arts in administration of justice, and began his career as a police officer in the Lawrence, Kansas Police Department.

In 1986 Akagi graduated from DEA Basic Agent Training. He has been stationed at a number of national and international offices, including Los Angeles, Dallas, and Santo Domingo. He also served for two years as an inspector in the Office of Professional Responsibility at DEA Headquarters.

Lunch with the League is a public service program open to the community. Membership in the *League of Women Voters* is not required and there is no cost to attend.

The presentation will begin at 12:00 noon. Box lunches are available at 11:30 a.m. on a first-come basis for \$8 or you may bring your own. Coffee and tea are provided.
