Stewart Clifton, lobbyist for the League of Women Voters of Tennessee will be the guest speaker at Lunch with the League on Tuesday, May 16 from 11:45 am to 1 pm in the Social Hall of the Oak Ridge Unitarian Universalist Church, located at 809 Oak Ridge Turnpike. He currently works with various groups such as Alliance for Nonprofit Excellence, Alzheimer's Tennessee, National Association of Social Workers, and Tennessee Association for the Education of Young Children.

A native Memphian, he has lived in Nashville since 1969. A member of the Tennessee Bar since 1977, he is a graduate of Vanderbilt University and Vanderbilt Law School. He worked as a staff attorney for the Legal Aid Society (Nashville and Middle Tennessee) and as staff attorney and then executive director of the TN Alliance for Legal Services for over two decades. He then established a government relations practice focused on nonprofit organizations.

Clifton also regularly volunteers to speak to citizen groups about how to effectively engage in public policy advocacy at the state and local level. He is a well-known presenter and speaker for attorneys, other professionals, and professional associations on topics including legislative advocacy, state and local government, public interest law, environmental law, and law as it relates to nonprofit corporations.
